

CP Supplemental Training

In addition to completing the initial Citizen Patrol (CP) training program, members are highly encouraged enroll in free, continuing education classes. Nearly all of the classes listed below can be taken free and online. CP members will accrue volunteer “hours” for each class/certificate achieved. CP members are asked to volunteer 6-hours per month to remain active. Completing these classes are a good way to earn your monthly hours despite being unable to attend a monthly CP training, patrol or other activity. If you earn a completion certificate, please forward the copy to the CP Liaison Deputy. These classes are meant to supplement, not replace, the monthly CP trainings.

Acquire a current 1 st Aid/CPR/AED certification via Red Cross (if you haven't done so via MCSO CP training)	6 hours
4-hour ride-along with a deputy. Arrange this via the CP Liaison Deputy. Authorized once/year	4 hours
Initiate a Corbett radio “check in” drill. 1-hour authorized per weekend check-in	1 hour
Provide a photo of your home’s 2-week food & water supply. Forward photo to the CP Liaison Deputy once/year	3 hours
Build/Maintain your “Response Go-Bag” and show it to the CP Liaison Deputy Click HERE and HERE for recommended contents	3 hours
Acquire your “Technician” level HAM license. ARRL.org	18 hours
View Red Cross shelter training & forward your summary notes & lessons learned to the CP Liaison Deputy	2 hours
Complete “ Skywarn ” weather spotter training and forward your summary notes and lessons learned to the CP Liaison Deputy	2 hours
